DECISIONS AND GUIDELINES

The course is compulsory within the Research School of Management and IT (MIT). Other doctoral students can take the course subject to availability.

GOAL

To develop an understanding of how information technology is studied in management and to be able to explain, discuss and compare different approaches.

CONTENT

Overview and historical perspective on Information Technology within Organization and Management Studies as well as contemporary issues such as strategy and change as well as service management and value creation. The content relates to several ongoing research projects within the framework of the course conducted at Uppsala University, Stockholm University and Karlstad University.

EXPECTED STUDY RESULTS

Learning objectives

The overall aim of the course is to develop the student's knowledge of how theories in business studies relate to IT.

After completing the course, the student should be able to:

Knowledge and understanding:

1. Explain, compare, and critically discuss central theories in business studies and how they relate to IT.

Skills and Abilities:

2. Systematically analyze and synthesize relevant theories about management and IT, as well as using these to analyze how business studies in harmony with technological development has changed over time.

Valuing ability and approach:

3. Reflect on and analyze the importance of theories in business studies and IT in society

EDUCATION

The course is given in English. The course contains a number of research-oriented seminars. The course ends with an essay about the course content.

EXAMINATION

Active participation in seminars and presentations. All seminars are compulsory. Failure to attend a seminar or a larger part of a seminar will require supplementary work. All activities (seminars and written submission) are in English.

If there are special reasons, the examiner may make exceptions to the specified examination method and allow a student to be examined in a different way. Special reasons can be, for example, notification of special educational support from the university's coordinator.
